*Lowestoft Lights.*

THE Corporation of the Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on or about the 1st day of October, 1866, the low light at Lowestoft will be removed from its present position to the new lighthouse on the Point of Lowestoftness.

The light will be exhibited at an elevation of 40 feet above high water, and will show *red* to seaward, and *green* through the roads, both to the northward and southward.

The new lighthouse bears S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{3}$  E, distant nearly half a mile from the high lighthouse, and E. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., rather more than a quarter of a mile from the present low lighthouse.

*Light Vessel near the One Fathom Bank.*

(No. 32.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ADRIATIC SEA.

*Fixed and Flashing Light on Rossa or Monte-Grugno Point.*

THE Minister of Marine at Florence has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of June, 1866, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Rossa or Monte-grugno Point, near Mattinata, coast of Italy.

The light is a *fixed* white light, varied by a *flash* every *three minutes*. It is placed at an elevation of 253 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is of stone with an octagonal base, 15 feet high, and stands about 23 yards from the keeper's dwelling, in lat. 41° 40' 50" N., long.—by Admiralty Chart—16° 2' 45" East of Greenwich.

**Manchester Division Petty Sessions Court Bill and the Corporation of Salford.**

(Power for the Corporation to increase their Contribution to the Salary of the Stipendiary Justice of the Division of Manchester.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that after the introduction of the above-mentioned Bill into Parliament a clause was inserted therein (on petition for additional provision to the House of Commons), empowering the Town Council of the borough of Salford, from time to time, in their absolute discretion, to direct the Treasurer of the said borough, for the time being, to pay out of the borough fund of the said borough (in addition to the yearly sum of £420 by "The Manchester Division Stipendiary Justice Act, 1864," directed to be paid out of the said borough fund to the Stipendiary Justice appointed under the provisions of that Act so long as the said Justice shall continue to discharge the duties of his said office as in the said Act mentioned,) any further sum or sums of money not exceeding in any one year such an amount as will make the contribution or quota of the said borough towards the yearly salary of the said Justice equivalent to one-half of the salary of such Justice for that year; which salary it is proposed by the Bill shall be increased to the yearly sum of £900, or such greater yearly sum not exceeding £1200, as the Justices for the Division of Manchester assembled in petty session, specially convened for that purpose, may from time to time think fit to direct.

#### The Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864.

The Worcester, Dean Forest, and Monmouth Railway (Deviation).

(Application to Board of Trade, Deviation of Worcester, Dean Forest, and Monmouth Railway; Tolls; Amendment of Acts.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that, pursuant to the provisions of "The Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864," application has been made by the Worcester, Dean Forest, and Monmouth Railway Company (herein called "The Company") to the Lords of the Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council appointed for the consideration of matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations (herein called "The Board of Trade") to make and issue a certificate, pursuant to the terms of the aforesaid Act, with the following powers and provisions, or some of them (that is to say):—
