# Lowestoft Lights.

THE Corporation of the Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on or about the 1st day of October, 1866, the low light at Lowestoft will be removed from its present position to the new lighthouse on the Point of Lowestoftness.

The light will be exhibited at an elevation of 40 feet above high water, and will show red to seaward, and green through the roads, both to the northward and southward.

The new lighthouse bears S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{3}$  E, distant nearly half a mile from the high lighthouse, and E. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., rather more than a quarter of a mile from the present low lighthouse.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Rossa or Monte-Grugno Point.

THE Minister of Marine at Florence has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of June, 1866, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Rossa or Monte-grugno Point, near Mattinata, coast of Italy.
