

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is of stone with an octagonal base, 15 feet high, and stands about 23 yards from the keeper's dwelling, in lat. 41° 40' 50" N., long.—by Admiralty Chart—16° 2' 45" East of Greenwich.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 33.)—JAVA SEA—WESTERN PART.

COMMANDER BULLOCK, of Her Majesty's steam vessel *Serpent*, having recently been ordered to examine the positions of various dangers, which lie in the track of vessels from Sunda strait and Batavia to Singapore, and shown on the Admiralty chart, Western part of the Java sea, No. 2,640; reports that the *Dolphin*, *Antelope*, *Jason*, *Banterer*, and *Anna Paulowna* shoals, were searched for, but without success.*

The position of the *Lyna* bank, which uncovers at low water; as well as that of the *Coventry Reef*, which also dries at low water, and on which the sea always breaks, have been accurately determined. The positions of several other dangers in this locality have also been rectified; but as they are too numerous to specify in a notice, mariners are informed that the chart has been corrected up to this date.
