

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WING, IN THE COUNTY OF BEDS.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, has been passed by the parish of Wing, in the county of Beds, the said parish being a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census. And whereas it does not appear to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that by reason of special circumstances, it is expedient that the said parish should be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby disapprove of such adoption by the parish of Wing aforesaid.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House, June 18, 1866.

NOTICE is hereby given, to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the tonnage bounties awarded for two slave dhows, names unknown, captured respectively on the 30th and 31st March, 1864, by Her Majesty's ship "Rapid."
