

Whitehall, July 6, 1866.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto William Earle Tyndale, of Holton Park, in the county of Oxford, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace, and a Deputy Lieutenant for the said county, Her Royal licence and authority that he may, in compliance with a direction contained in the last will and testament of Elisha Biscoe, of Holton Park aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, henceforth take and use the surname of Biscoe only, and bear the arms of Biscoe quarterly with those of Tyndale, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
