WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the session of the twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and nineteen, it is (amongst other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time, to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places as they may designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas the said Act has been amended and explained by an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter

"one hundred and seven, to prevent the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals:"

And whereas a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as "Cattle Plague," now prevails among cattle in England and Wales:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the introduction of cattle and other animals from England and Wales into Scotland:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given by the said recited Act, and by the several Acts continuing and amending the same as aforesaid, order as follows:

1. Sections 3 and 5 of the Order of Council of 11th August, 1866, are hereby revoked.

2. From and after the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove cattle or other animals from any port or place in England or Wales to any port or place in Scotland.

3. Nothing contained in this Order shall affect the regulations at present in force under any Order of Council in regard to cattle or other animals brought by sea from any place in the United Kingdom other than England or Wales, or from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in Scotland; and it is hereby declared and ordered that cattle or other animals brought by sea from one place in Scotland to any other place therein shall not be removed from such place alive without a certificate from the Local Authority having jurisdiction in such place that such cattle have been examined by some officer appointed for that purpose by such authority, and that such cattle are free from disease.

4. This Order shall be construed in like manner as the Order of the 11th April, 1866, and all the provisions therein contained shall continue in force and shall apply hereto in so far as the same can be applicable and are not inconsistent herewith; and the violation of any part of this Order shall be an offence subject to the penalty incurred under the said Order by the committing any offence against it.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing a copy of an announcement with reference to a contemplated exhibition of hops and beer, to be held at Dijon, in the month of October next, and of which the following is a translation :—

*International Exhibition of Hops and Beer.*

THE Central Agricultural Committee of the Côte d'Or has decided upon organizing an International Exhibition of Hops and Beer, in the year 1866.

This exhibition will take place at Dijon, towards the middle of the month of October next.

All producers of hops and manufacturers of beer in France and in foreign countries will be permitted to take part in it. Several gold medals, of at least three hundred francs in value, medals of silver, and other rewards, will be distributed to the exhibitors of the best productions.

Besides the samples of hops and beer, all kinds of instruments and apparatus employed in the cultivation of hops and in the manufacture of beer will be received, as well as papers treating of matters connected with either subject.

Applications from persons desirous of becoming exhibitors can at once be addressed to M. Ladrey, Secretary to the Committee, Dijon. The 15th of September is fixed as the latest date for the sending in of such applications. A detailed programme will very shortly be published, which will make known the different arrangements for the exhibition, as well as the precise date at which the packages should be forwarded.

#### INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 28th year of Her Majesty, cap. 30, for granting to Her Majesty certain duties of Customs and Inland Revenue, power is given for increasing in certain cases the number of persons appointed under the provision made by the Act passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty, cap. 35, Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax Acts, and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each district or division in Great Britain; and, it appearing to the Board of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so appointed for the hundred of Cashio, in the county of Hertford, is insufficient for the proper discharge of the business therein arising under the Income Tax Act, the said Board hereby authorise the increase in the number of the Commissioners for the said hundred to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen; and we, the undersigned, two members of the said Board, do hereby convene a meeting of the persons appointed for putting in execution within the said county, an Act passed in the 38th year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the service of the year 1798," being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners, in the execution of the last-mentioned Act, to be holden at the Corn
