WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the 19th day of June last, reciting that by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the session of the twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and nineteen, it was (amongst other things) enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time to make such Orders and Regulations as to them might seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places as they might designate in such Order or Orders of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained should have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And that the said Act had been amended and explained by an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven, to prevent the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals:"

And that a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," had lately appeared, and then prevailed amongst cattle in England and Wales:

And that divers Orders had been made by the Lords of the said Council in relation to the cattle plague, which had been consolidated and amended by an Order bearing date the 24th day of March last:

And that provisions were contained in the said Order of the Privy Council to regulate the movement of cattle on any highway, and such movement without a licence as therein described was prohibited, except for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards, from one part of the same farm to the other:

And that the holding of markets for the sale of cattle was prohibited by the said Order until the 1st day of June, 1866, except in the case of a market held with the licence of the Privy Council for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter, which term had, by an Order of the said Council, been extended from the said 1st day of June until the said Lords of the Council should otherwise direct:

And that there was a market held in the borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the county of Northumberland, which is contiguous to the borough of Gateshead, in the county of Durham, for the sale of cattle, and the holding thereof had been licensed by the Lords of the said Council, by instrument bearing date the 31st day of May last, for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter, so long as the said above-mentioned Orders should remain in force, or until the revocation thereof as therein provided, subject to all the conditions, provisions, and regulations in the said first-mentioned Order contained applicable to such market:

And that it was provided by the said Order of the 24th of March last, that in the case of cattle brought to any market other than the Metropolitan Cattle Market, they should in no case be taken beyond such limits as might be described in the licence of the Privy Council allowing such market, and under such conditions with respect to their movement within such limits as might be imposed by such licence:

And that in the said licence for the holding of the above-mentioned market, it was provided that no cattle brought into the said market should be taken alive beyond the district comprised within

the outer municipal boundaries of the said two boroughs, and it was expedient that certain other regulations should be made in this behalf :

The Lords of the Council therefore did thereby order, that notwithstanding such provision in the said licence, cattle other than such as may be brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, sold in the said market might, until the 30th day of September next, if the said licence should continue so long in force, be moved to any slaughter-house in the borough of Sunderland, in the said county of Durham, but not further, to be there immediately slaughtered under such regulations as the Local Authority for the county of Durham should, from time to time, make and issue in regard to the movement as well as the times, places, and manner of slaughtering of such cattle, and certain other provisions were made, and among others that every person who should contravene that Order, or any regulation of the Local Authority made under it, should be guilty of an offence, and be subject to the like penalty as in the case of a contravention of any regulation in the said Order of the 24th of March last :

And whereas the said Order of the 19th of June last has been continued by the Lords of the Council, by an Order dated the 28th day of September, until the 31st day of December next, and the said licence still continues in force for the said market, and it is expedient to extend the provisions of the said Order of the 19th of June last, continued by the Order of the 28th day of September as aforesaid, in the manner hereafter set forth :

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Council do hereby order, that notwithstanding the said provision in the said Order of the 24th of March and the said licence respectively, cattle other than such as may be brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, sold in the said market, may, so long as the said licence shall continue in force, be moved to any slaughter-house in the borough of South Shields, or in the town of Jarrow, in the county of Durham, or in the borough of Tynemouth, or in the town of North Shields, in the county of Northumberland, but not further, to be then immediately slaughtered, under such regulations as the Local Authorities for the respective counties of Durham and Northumberland shall from time to time make and issue, as in the above-recited Order of the 19th of June last.

Provided that such cattle shall be moved by railway only from the borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne to North or South Shields, or Tynemouth, or to Jarrow, as the case may be ; and provided that nothing herein contained shall allow the cattle to be kept alive for more than four days after exposure in the said market.

Every regulation made by the said Local Authority shall be published in some newspaper circulating in the said borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and also in the said other boroughs

and town to which it applies respectively ; and the provision of the said Order of the 19th of June last, relating to the penalty for the contravention thereof, shall apply to this Order ; and the said Order and this Order shall be construed as the Order of 24th of March last, except where there would be any inconsistency in such construction.

WHEREAS by divers Orders of Her Majesty's Privy Council, duly issued under the authority of the Act, passed in the Session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued, by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, which Orders recited that a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," prevailed amongst cattle in England and Wales; the Lords of the Council have made various regulations for preventing the spread of the Cattle Plague, and among other matters have provided for the movement of cattle upon highways in England and Wales, and for the importation of cattle into England and Wales from Ireland ;

And whereas it is expedient that fresh regulations should be made in respect of cattle imported from Ireland and afterwards moved in England and Wales, and also in respect of cattle moved from Scotland into England and Wales :

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council do hereby order as follows :—

1. From and after the date of this Order, cattle may be imported from Ireland and landed at any port or place in England and Wales, except in South Wales and Monmouth, and be moved to the place of their ultimate destination in England or Wales, subject to the following provisions, anything in any Order heretofore issued by the Privy Council to the contrary notwithstanding.

2. Previous to such cattle leaving Ireland the owner may obtain a licence for the moving of such cattle in the following form, and cattle imported from Ireland may be moved in England or Wales with such a license:—

IRISH CATTLE.

FORM OF LICENCE.

I, _____, being appointed by the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland for such purpose, do hereby license the person named below to move the cattle described in the annexed Certificate from the port of _____, in Ireland, to _____, in England or Wales, being the place of their ultimate destination, by the route described below, so that the said cattle shall not be driven

of the said Act in Great Britain; and I hereby certify, after due examination and inquiry, that the aforesaid head of Cattle are free from disease, and have not been exposed to the infection of Cattle Plague for, at least, two months previous to the present date, that disease having been absent from Ireland for more than that period.

3. Nothing herein contained shall apply to cattle imported from Ireland to be slaughtered in the port or place at which they are landed; but all the provisions of the several Orders now in force relating to cattle so landed shall continue to apply thereto.

4. Animals may be moved from Scotland into England and Wales, with a licence in the form described in the Order of Council bearing date the 11th day of April last, and designated Store Stock Licence, together with the declaration and certificate which accompany the same.

5. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to any part of England and Wales where, under any Order of the Privy Council, the Local Authority is empowered to make special regulations as to the movement of animals into its district.

6. This Order shall be construed in like manner as the Order of the 24th of March last; and the provisions of the said Order relative to the offences in contravention thereof, and the penalties for the same, and otherwise now in force, except so far as they may be inconsistent with anything herein contained, shall be applied to this Order.

And that it was provided by the said Order of the 24th of March last, that in the case of cattle brought to any market other than the Metropolitan Cattle Market, they shall in no case be taken beyond such limits as may be described in the licence of the Privy Council allowing such market, and under such conditions with respect to their movement within such limits as may be imposed by such licence:

And that in the said licence for the holding of the above-mentioned market, it was provided that no cattle brought into the said market should be taken alive beyond the limits of the municipal boundaries of the boroughs of Salford and Manchester; and it was expedient that certain other regulations should be made in this behalf:

The Lords of the Council did thereby order, that notwithstanding such provision in the said licence, cattle sold in the said market might, until the 30th day of September then next, if the said licence should so long continue in force, be moved for a distance extending twelve miles from the said market, but not further, to any slaughterhouse, to be there immediately slaughtered, under such regulations as the Local Authority for the county of Lancaster should from time to time make and issue in regard to the movement as well as the places, times, and manner of slaughtering of such cattle :

Provided, that if any cattle shall be moved for a distance exceeding five miles in a direct line from such market, the cattle should be moved by railway only from the market to their ultimate destination, or to within one mile thereof ; and provided also, that nothing therein contained should allow the cattle to be kept alive for more than four days after exposure in the said market :

And whereas the said Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of the reign of Her Majesty has been continued until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, and by an Act of the last session it is advisable that the said Order of the 7th of June last should be renewed and continued as herein provided :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order that the said recited Order bearing date the 7th day of June last shall be renewed and continued in force until the thirty-first day of December next.

(No. 57.)—BLACK SEA—RIVER BUG.

Red Light near Sievers Point.

The Imperial Ministry of Marine at St. Petersburg have given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a wooden tower, erected on rising ground near Sievers point, on the left bank of the Bug river.

The light is a *fixed red* light, at an elevation of 55 feet above the level of the river; and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles. The light is distant 818 yards in a N.
