

CONTRACT FOR OILS.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Thursday, the 25th instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, all such quantities of SPERMACETI, RAPE, AND COLZA OILS, as may from time to time be demanded, under a contract for twelve calendar months certain, and further, until the expiration of three calendar months' warning.

Samples (not less than a gallon of each description of oil) must be produced by the parties tendering.

5,000 TONS OF COALS,

1,000 tons of the coals to be shipped by the 30th November, 2,000 tons more thereof in the month of December, and the remainder thereof in the month of January next.

One-third of the quantity to be shipped in each of the above-mentioned periods to consist of North of England Coals, and two-thirds of South Wales Coals.
