WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the 24th day of March last, duly issued under the authority of the Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, c. 107, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the 1st day of September, 1850, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued by divers subsequent Acts, which Order recited that a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," prevailed amongst cattle in England and Wales, the Lords of the Council made various regulations for preventing the spread of the cattle plague, and, among other matters, ordered that no market, fair, auction, exhibition, or sale of cattle should be held until the 1st day of June, 1866, except otherwise excepted; and whereas by an Order of the Lords of the Council, bearing date the 26th day of May last, the said regulation was continued until the Lords of the Council should otherwise order:

And whereas it is advisable that the said regulation should be altered as regards the county of Anglesey in the manner hereinafter provided.

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Council do hereby order, that the Local Authority in the county of Anglesey may grant licences for the holding of fairs, whereat cattle may be sold, so that a separate licence be granted for every fair, and that the same shall be revocable at the discretion of the said Local Authority, and be in writing, and in such form as the Local Authority shall deem to be expedient, and at any fair, held under such licence, cattle may be sold, anything in the said Order to the contrary notwithstanding.

This Order shall be construed in like manner as the said Order of the 24th day of March last,

and all the provisions therein contained shall apply to this Order, so far as the same shall be applicable.

WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council did, amongst other things, make certain provisions applicable only to the counties enumerated in a schedule thereunto annexed, and to the counties of cities, or towns, cities, and boroughs therein contained:

And whereas by a further Order, bearing date the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the said Lords did make certain other provisions applicable only to the counties enumerated in the above-mentioned schedule, and to the county of Oxford:

And whereas the counties of Nottingham, Northampton, Norfolk, and Lincoln were included in the said schedule, and it is expedient that the said provisions of the above mentioned Orders of the 8th day of August and the 18th day of September, 1866, should no longer apply to the said counties:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Council do hereby order that from and after the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the counties of Nottingham, Northampton, and Norfolk, and the Parts of Kesteven in the county of Lincoln, and the counties of cities, or towns, cities, and boroughs therein contained, shall no longer be subject to such provisions of the Orders of the 8th day of August and the 18th day of September, 1866, as are applicable only to the counties enumerated in the above mentioned schedule.
