LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

HEBDEN BRIDGE AND WADSWORTH.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted by the districts of Hebdon Bridge and Wadsworth, both in the West Riding of the county of York; and whereas the Local Boards in and for the said districts have by resolutions respectively passed by the first herein
