Vienna, Febr. 1. We have now the particular account of the Surrender of *Mongatz*, in this manner. That Count *Caraffa* coming thither on his way to *Transylvania*, he sent a Message to the Princess *Ragotzki*, to acquaint her, That as he had before writ to her to put her in mind of providing for her Safety, by a speedy return to her Duty; so he was now there to receive her Answer. She made a civil Reply, promising, That she would the next day send her Deputies with Instructions to Treat, and accordingly her Confessor, and some other Gentlemen, came, with whom that matter was debated, some few days. The Points they had Orders to insist upon, most, were for the including *Teckelej* and his Adherents in this Caprulation, and to secure them all their Pardons. But Count *Caraffa* looking upon these Demands as Degratory from the Honour of his Imperial Majesty, declared, that this Affair was of that nature, and the present Circumstances such, as the Emperor was to give the Law in this Case, and not receive it; and therefore, he tendered them a draught of Articles, which they must accept without any Alteration, or expect all the ill Consequences of a Refusal; and they were these. I. A Free Pardon was extended to all and every one then residing at *Mongatz*, of what Quality or Condition soever, of all Offences and Crimes committed at any time during these Troubles; and that none shall be prosecuted or molested for any thing said, writ, or done, or for any Injury or Damage committed, or upon any other Pretence whatsoever, for any thing that had passed to that time. II. That the Princess and her Children by her former Husband, with a convenient Attendance, shall go to *Vienna* to continue there with Security, and without any restraint upon her Person or Children, with this Limitation, That she nor they are not to remove from thence without Leave first had from his Imperial Majesty. III. All the Real Estate shall remain as it now is, under the Direction of the Treasury; but the Personal Estate, whether in *Mongatz*, *Hungary*, or what other place it may be found, shall all be restored to the Children: As to the Dominion of *Mongatz*; and the Territory of *Mielos*, which are not reckoned to belong to the Kingdom of *Hungary*, the Restitution of them is suspended till his Imperial Majesties Pleasure be known. IV. That the Princess shall have the Benefit of her Dower, settled upon her Marriage with Prince *Ragotzki*, either out of some other Equivalent Estate, or the Legal Interest of the full Value thereof; and that there be no prejudice to the Orphans, she shall declare upon Oath, what is justly belonging to her; and deliver likewise upon Oath, an Inventory of what she knows to appertain to her Children, whether in *Mongatz* or elsewhere, to be put into the hands of the Commissioners of the Treasury, the Guardianship of the said Children belonging to his Majesty. V. That the Princess deliver up the Standard, Ducal Cap, with other Emblems of Sovereignty (which are known to be in her Custody,) wherewith *Teckelej* was Invested by Sultan *Mahomet*, as Prince of *Hungary*: And that she give an Account upon Oath of all Jewels, or other things of Value, belonging to *Teckelej*, or any other of the Rebels his Adherents. VI. In the like manner, all other Persons within the said Garison, shall, when required, declare upon Oath, what, of their Knowledge, belongs to any of the absent Rebels, and deliver up the same, with the Artillery, Arms, and all Ammunition belonging to the place. VII. The Estates, Real or Personal, of all Persons of Quality and others now within *Mongatz*, that lay hold of the Grace offered them, shall be restored to the respective Owners, whether they are found in the Town or without; but this shall no way extend to such as are out of the Town and in Rebellion, unless it be to one or two of those who are retired into *Poland*, upon whose having recourse to the Imperial Clemency, it will be granted them at the Intercession of the Princess. VIII. All who now deliver up themselves are to take an Oath of Fidelity, and are peaceably to return to their respective Homes; and are not to stir out of their Province, or the Kingdom, without Leave from the Officer Commanding in Chief in the Places of their Residence; and if any are found to act contrary, or to hold any Correspondency with *Teckelej*, under any pretence whatsoever, they shall lose all the Benefit of these Concessions. IX. What Deeds and Evidences, which have been brought to *Mongatz* during these Disturbances, belonging to other Persons, shall be restored to those to whom of Right they belong. X.
