West Indies. to British Columbia, Vancouver's Ishand, or the Sandwich Islands, there shall be charged and taken the several rates of postare (British and foreign combined) following; that is to say:-

On every such packet if not exceeding four ounces in weight $a$ rate of postage of four pence;
And on every such packet, if exceeding four ounces in weight, thereshall be charged and taken the several further and additional and -progressive rates of postage hereinafter mentioned.
9) All such respective packets as hereinbefore in thie 6 th, 7 th, and 8 th clauses of this Warrant respectively mentioned, if exceeding four ounces in weigit, shall be subject to the several further and additional and progressice rates of postage hereinafter meutioned ; that is to say:-

For the purposes of this Warrant every printed newspaper transmitted by the post under the provisions of this Warrant shall be deemed and considered a packet, and shall be charged and chargeable with a separate and distinct single rate of postage, or separate and distinct progressive and additional rates of postage according to. the weight thereof as hereinbefore mentioned, notwithstanding two or more newspapers shall le enclosed and transmitted in one aud the same cover, wrapper, envelope, or bundle, and form only one parcel or bundle of newspapers, and every printed supplement or additional sheet to any newspaper shall, for the purpose of charging the postage under this Warrant, be deemed :a distinct newspaper unless sept in the same cover or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.
11. Every packet which shall be transmitted by the post under the $6 \mathrm{th}, 7$ th, and 8 th clauses of this Warrant shall be so transmitted in conformity with, and under and subject to, the several regulations, orders, directions, aud conditions hereinafter contained ; that is to say :

No such packet shall contain any written letter or any communication in the nature of a lutter closed or open, nor any enclosure senled or otherwise closed against inspection, nor any communication of the nature of a letter written in or upon any such: packet or the cover thereof;
No such packet which in length shall exceed two feet (British), or in breadth or degth one foot (British), shall be forwarded by the post
under the provisions of this Warrant, unless unler the special auilhority of the Postmasterh General ;
There shall be no word or communication printed on any newspaper after ite publication thereof, or upon any cover thereof; nor any writing of marks upon any such newspaper, th or apon apy coyer fhereof, other: thian and except the; name atd addreess of the perso tò whom the signe is gent but the name or tiffe of such nevspaper, and the nam nọd adareess of the publisher, newsvendar, or gegnt by whom the same is sent, may be prinitet ont tha

12. The postage of ery letter and packet transmitted by the post under the authority of thits Warrant shall be paid at the time of the same being posted,
13. If any letter or packet be posted or bu trangmitted by the post, under thile Warrant, which shall be otherwise than in cónformity with the conditions and regulations fiereinbétore established in relation thereto, the same shall ana may be detained and opened, and shall be returieid or given up to the sender thiereof:
14. The sevèral rates of postage chargeable on letters and printed newspapers transinitted : by the post, und der the protisions of this Wairrant, glat be in hielu of any rates of "postage now' chargeable by liaw thèreón:
15. The ferm " wheight" used initlis Warrant, shall mean British weight; and the several: other térims and expresions used in this. Warrant ghall be construed to haye: the like meaning in , all respects as they wóuld bave Lad if inserted in, the sside Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.
