THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Vienna, the Order, of which the following is a translation, issued by the Austrian Government:—

(Translation.)

ORDER of the Austrian Foreign Finance and Commercial Departments, dated 20th December, 1866, respecting the Customs' treatment of British, Italian, and French productions, which is to come into operation on the 1st of January, 1867, and to take effect in all the countries of the General Austrian Customs' Jurisdiction.

In pursuance of the Treaty of Commerce between Austria and Great Britain of 16th December, 1865 ("Reichs-gesetz-Blatt" for 1866, No. 2), of the Treaty of Peace between Austria and Italy of 3rd October, 1866 ("Reichs-gesetz-Blatt," No. 116), and of the Treaty of Commerce between Austria and France of 11th December, 1866 ("Reichs-gesetz-Blatt," No. 164), which assume to British, Italian, and French productions the treatment of the most favoured nation, it is ordered:—

1. That from the 1st of January, 1867, the Special Tariff A, contained in Annex A to the Commercial and Customs Treaty concluded between Austria and the German Zollverein on the 11th of April, 1865 ("Reichs-gesetz-Blatt," No. 22), is to be applied, in so far as a still more favourable treatment is not conceded by the General Austrian Tariff or by special ordinances, not only to the productions of the Zollverein countries, but also to those of Great Britain, Italy, and France, let their importation into Austria take place at whatever boundary it may, either by land or water.

The following items of the aforesaid Special Tariff are excepted from this rule, viz., No. 1, letters a and b (grain and pulse, meal and mill-produce); No. 2, letters b and c (garden-produce and fruit, prepared); No. 4, letters a to g (cattle for draught and slaughter); No. 6, letter g (cheese); No. 9, letter a (bread, common); No. 14, letter a (turpentine and oil of turpentine); No. 30, letter b (floor covering and mats of bast, rushes, &c.); and No. 36, letter a (ordinary crockery ware); the stipulations in regard to these items

are still restricted to the traffic from the Zollverein over the boundaries between Austria and the Zollverein countries.

2. That to establish the claim to the favourable treatment, it is requisite that the British, Italian, or French origin of the goods be stated in both copies of the Goods Declaration, which is to be produced at the Custom-house.

In the event of any doubt arising as to the correctness of this statement, the origin of the goods is to be proved by a certificate, which may be given by the local authority or the proper Custom-house in the country whence the goods come, or by an Austrian Consular functionary there, or by the production of the bill of lading.

The aforesaid certificate of origin is only to be demanded when the question is as to the Customs treatment of cloth and woven goods, beverages and spirituous liquors, or glass wares.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF DRIGHLINGTON, IN THE PARISH OF BIRSTAL, IN THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

WHEREAS notice in writing has been duly given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the 20th day of July, 1866, adopted by the township of Drighlington, in the parish of Birstal, in the West Riding of the county of York; and whereas appeal has been duly made to me, under the provisions of the said Act, against the validity of the vote of adoption of such Act; and report has been made to me thereon, by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed for the purpose.

ORDER APPROVING OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY LITTLE WOOLTON (TOWNSHIP), LANCASHIRE.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 84.)—NETHERLANDS.

Fixed Lights at the Entrance of the Schelde.

INFORMATION has been received at this Office to the following effect, viz.:

That on and after the 1st day of December, 1866, three new lights would be exhibited in the Oost gat at the entrance of the Schelde, on the south-west coast of Walcheren island, Netherlands.

1st. A *fixed* white light on a dune or sandhill, a little north of Zoutelande, visible through an arc of 30°, or between the bearings North to N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. It is elevated 46 feet above the ordinary high-water level, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. West Kapelle light bears N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from it.

2nd. On the dunes immediately south of those called Kaapduinen two *fixed* white lights are placed, bearing from each other N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 126 yards. They are visible through an arc of 30°, or between the bearings S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. The northern light is elevated 47 feet, and the southern one 90 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus of the three lights is dioptric or by lenses.

Directions.—Coming from seaward for the entrance of the Oost gat, when the West Kapelle light bears East, bring the two lights of Kaapduinen in line S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and keep them so until the Zoutelande light is in a line with the West Kapelle light; then keep these latter lights in line, taking care to avoid the white buoy off the southern part of the Zoutelande bank. As the buoy of the Nolle plaat is placed on the line of these lights care must be taken, after sighting Flushing light, to avoid it.
