hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Simon, situate within the limits of such parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Simon, Sheffield," and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry, should belong to and should be exercised jointly by the persons mentioned and described in and contemplated by the hereinbeforementioned indenture of the fifteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, which said indenture is deposited in the diocesan registry at York.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem

meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Simon, Sheffield, being:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Sheffield, and of the chapelry district of Saint Mary, Sheffield, both in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, which are bounded on the north-east by the chapelry district of Saint Paul, Sheffield, in the said county and diocese, on the north-west by the new parish of Carver-street by the new parish of Eldon, and by the district of Gilcar, all in the same county and diocese, and on the remaining side, that is to say, on the south by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said district of Gilcar from the said chapelry district of Saint Mary, Sheffield, at a point in the middle of the bridge which carries the road connecting South-street and the street called Little Sheffield over the River Porter, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said river (following as to the latter part of the same the boundary which divides the said parish of Sheffield from the chapelry district of Saint Mary, Sheffield, aforesaid) as far as the boundary which divides the said parish of Sheffield from the chapelry district of Saint Paul, Sheffield,

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the cighth and ninth years of Her Majesty,

chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a representation bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Lawley, in the parish of Wellington, in the county of Salop, and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Wellington, of the parish of Little Wenlock, in the said county of Salop, and in the diocese of Hereford, and of the new parish of Christ Church, Wellington, in the same county, and in the diocese of Lichfield aforesaid, which lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes and now parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expededient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Wellington, of the said parish of Little Wenlock, and of the said new parish of Christ Church, Wellington, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Lawley aforesaid.
