stipulations for the Arrangement concluded between France and Peru, January 15, 1864 :

Dating from the day when this Arrangement shall have been approved by the Government of His Majesty the Emperor, guano imported from Peru under all flags will be admitted without payment of the custom-house duties into the ports of France and the French colonies.

Commencing from the same date, the price of Peruvian guano sold in France and the French colonies, whatever the amount sold, will be reduced to three hundred francs per ton of one thousand kilogrammes.

Whenever the sale price of this guano in the European markets shall be increased or diminished the price of three hundred francs fixed for France shall be raised and lowered in the same proportion. The same will hold good in the French colonies in case of an increase or diminution in the actual prices of sale in the markets of the neighbouring English possessions.

Commencing from the same date, borax imported direct from Peru into France will be admitted, under whatever flag it may be imported, free of custom-house duties if it is raw, and at a duty of five per cent. of its value if it is halfrefined.

The present Arrangement will have a fixed duration of five years, dating from this day (December 2, 1866), and after that date it will remain binding from year to year until one of the two Governments may have announced, one year beforehand, its intention of putting an end to its powers.
