

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the slave and tonnage bounties awarded for two dhows, names unknown, captured on the 15th April and 11th May, 1865, respectively, by Her Majesty's ship "Penguin."

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the said proceeds, are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the High Court of Admiralty, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Due notice will be given, by future advertisements in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and at the same time, the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Bapchild, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, one capital sum of four hundred and twenty-five pounds and thirteen shillings, such capital sum to be applied by us in discharging the amount payable to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, for the augmentation and maintenance of the poor clergy, under two subsisting mortgages of the said vicarage of Bapchild, which were effected by two deeds, bearing date respectively the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, for the purpose of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice of Bapchild.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the perpetual curacy of Saint John, Bacup, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to his successors, incumbents of the same benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at

any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, having received a benefaction of one hundred pounds sterling, in favour of the perpetual curacy of Saint Anne, Buck's Mills, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, in consideration whereof we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same benefice, and to his successors, a yearly sum of three pounds six shillings and eight pence, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Saint Anne, Buck's Mills, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one other yearly sum or stipend of three pounds six shillings and eight pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the yearly sum or stipend so payable out of our common fund as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
