WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twentyninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the Perpetual Curacy of Holy Trinity, Corris, in the county of Merioneth, and in the diocese of Bangor, and to his successors, incumbents of the same benefice, all those tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes, with their appurtenances, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes, with their appurtenances, to the use of the same benefice shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits and proceeds of the said tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes, with their appurtenances, as from the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.
