**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of July, 1867.

**W**HEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, duly issued under the authority of the Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," which Act has been continued until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, - by divers statutes, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, it was among other things ordered, that until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into the Metropolis should be marked as therein mentioned, and that no such cattle should be removed therefrom alive except by sea:

And whereas by a subsequent Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the time so limited was extended until the Lords of the said Council should otherwise order, and certain other provisions were made in respect of cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom and landed at any place therein:

And whereas by another Order, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May last, it was, among other things, ordered that cattle brought from sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and landed at any place in England, should not be moved from the landing place where landed for the period of twelve hours from the time of landing, but should remain for such period in some lair or other proper place adjacent to such landing place to be provided for their reception, for the purpose of being in-

spected by a competent inspector, and no cattle should be landed from any vessel until such lair or other proper place should have been provided; and further that when by any Order or Orders of the Privy Council cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, should be permitted to be moved to the Metropolitan Cattle Market, no such cattle should be moved to such market except by railway, and that all cattle brought by railway to such market should be discharged from the trucks in which they should have been conveyed within one thousand yards of the said Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, and should be driven immediately upon being so discharged, to such market or to the lairs belonging thereto, or to such other lairs as might have been licensed by the Privy Council for the reception of such cattle:

And whereas the disease commonly termed the "Cattle Plague" still exists in certain parts of England:

And whereas it is expedient that certain other regulations should be made in regard to foreign cattle moved to the Metropolitan Cattle Market:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby further order as follows:—

1. When any cattle intended for sale in the said market shall be brought by sea as aforesaid into the port of London, and shall be landed at any wharf or other landing-place within the said port, and shall have remained in the lair or other proper place as aforesaid for the period above mentioned, and shall have been duly inspected as aforesaid, and shall have been pronounced by the Inspector to be free from disease, the same may, by a licence to be granted by the Lords of Her Majesty's Council, upon such terms or conditions as the said Lords shall deem satisfactory, be moved by water, but not otherwise, to some other wharf or landing-place within the said port of London, and removed therefrom to the said market, in accordance with the provisions contained in the said Order of the twenty-seventh day of May last.

2. No cattle shall be moved to the said market after being so landed at such last-mentioned wharf or landing place, except in conformity with this Order.

3. The words herein contained shall be construed as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth
