

North Riding of Yorkshire, to Wit.

Midsummer Sessions, 1867.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the Lady the Queen, holden for the North Riding of the county of York, at Northallerton, in the said Riding, on Tuesday in the first week after the 24th day of June, to wit, the 2nd day of July, in the thirty-first year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria the First, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, before the Right Honourable Alan Earl Cathcart (Chairman), The Right Honourable Charles John Lord Teignmouth, The Honourable Amias Charles Orde Powlett, and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said Riding, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors, committed within the Riding aforesaid.

Whereas at the last General Quarter Sessions of the Peace holden at Northallerton, in and for the said Riding, on the 9th day of April last, a Provisional Order for dividing the said Riding into nineteen highway districts, under the provisions of the Act of the 25th and 26th Victoria, chapter 61, was made in manner and to the effect therein set forth, and it was thereby ordered that the confirmation or otherwise of the said Provisional Order should be taken into consideration at this present Court of General Quarter Sessions. And whereas the said Provisional Order having been taken into consideration at this present Court of General Quarter Sessions, and it appearing expedient that the said Provisional Order should be varied:

Now, therefore, it is ordered by this Court that the said Provisional Order so made as aforesaid shall be and the same is hereby varied in manner hereinafter set forth.

And it is ordered that the said Riding shall be divided into sixteen highway districts to be respectively known by the several names, and to comprise the several parishes and townships hereinafter set forth:—
