WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, it is (amongst other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time, to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places as they may designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas divers Orders, in pursuance of the said recited Act, made by the Lords of the said Council, in relation to the contagious or infectious disorder generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," which then prevailed in certain parts of England, were consolidated by an Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one

thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and the Lords of the said Council did thereby make various regulations for preventing the spread of the said cattle plague, and among others for dealing with infected places:

And whereas among other regulations contained in such Order, it was ordered that no dung of animals, and no hay, straw, litter, or other articles forming the food of animals, or used for or about animals, should be removed out of an infected place without the licence as therein provided of some officer of the Local Authority appointed to issue such licences, certifying that such articles had not been in contact with, or been used about, a diseased animal:

And whereas the said cattle plague still exists in some parts of England:

And whereas it is considered expedient that further regulations should be made with regard to the movement of dung and litter out of any place within the Metropolis, or the City of London, including the Liberties thereof, which may be infected within the meaning and operation of the said Order:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order as follows:—

1. From and after the seventeenth day of this instant July, notwithstanding the said regulation contained in the said recited Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the dung and litter of animals may be removed out of any place within the districts of the Metropolis, and the city of London, including the Liberties thereof, which shall have been or shall be declared to be infected within the meaning and operation of the said Order, notwithstanding that such dung shall be the dung of a diseased animal, or that such dung or litter may have been in contact with, or used about, a diseased animal:

2. Provided that no such dung or litter shall be moved out of such infected place without a licence in writing of some officer appointed by the Local Authority to issue such licences, certifying that such dung or litter has been thoroughly disinfected, and provided that no such licence shall authorize the removal of such dung or litter beyond the district of the Local Authority in which the infected place is situate.

3. The words herein contained shall be construed as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of

March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and all the provisions therein contained relative to the offences for the contravention thereof, and the penalty for the same, and in respect of the powers of officers employed under it, and all other provisions of that Order, and the subsequent Orders altering it, now in force, and not inconsistent with anything herein contained, shall, in respect of every matter and thing to which they shall be applicable, apply to the regulations contained in this Order and the enforcing the same, and the officers employed under it.

4. The Local Authority for the Metropolis shall forthwith cause this Order to be published in some newspaper circulating in the Metropolis, and also cause a copy thereof to be affixed at some conspicuous place in the said Metropolitan Cattle Market at Islington; and the Commissioners of Police for the Metropolis and the City of London shall cause a copy thereof to be affixed at some conspicuous place at each police station in their respective districts.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, duly issued under the authority of the Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," which Act has been continued until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, by divers statutes, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, it was among other things ordered, that until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in England should be marked as therein mentioned, and that no such cattle should be removed therefrom alive except by sea:

And whereas by a subsequent Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the time so limited was extended until the Lords of the said Council should otherwise order, and among other things, it was ordered that all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and landed at any place in the United Kingdom, should be taken forthwith to the market held and duly

licensed by the Lords of the Council for the sale of cattle for immediate slaughter, if any such there should be within the said place, which should be held within four days from the landing of such cattle; and if there should be no such market duly licensed within such place, or if the market duly licensed should not be held within four days from the landing of such cattle, such cattle should be slaughtered at such place before the expiration of such four days:

And whereas by another Order, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May last, it was, among other things, ordered that cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and landed at any place in England, should not be moved from the landing-place where landed for the period of twelve hours from the time of landing, but should remain for such period in some lair or other proper place adjacent to such landing-place to be provided for their reception, for the purpose of being inspected by a competent inspector, and no cattle should be landed from any vessel until such lair or other proper place should have been provided:

And whereas the disease commonly termed the "Cattle Plague" still exists in certain parts of England:

And whereas the port of Sunderland, in the county of Durham, is a port into which cattle have been and can be imported from countries not parts of the United Kingdom:

And whereas the part of the said port of Sunderland into which cattle so imported may be landed has been defined by an Order of the said Council bearing date the twelfth day of this present month of July, and in such Order it is provided that all cattle so landed should be slaughtered within such part of the said port so defined as aforesaid:

And whereas it is advisable to make provision for the re-shipment of such cattle for the purpose of being conveyed to certain other ports and places in England:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order as follows:

1. From and after the seventeenth day of this present July when any cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom shall be landed at the part of the said port of Sunderland, so defined by the said recited Order of the twelfth day of this present month of July, and shall have remained in the lair or other proper place as aforesaid for the period above mentioned, and shall have been duly inspected as aforesaid, and shall have been certified by the Inspector to be free from disease, the same may, under such regulations as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs shall from time to time prescribe for this purpose, be re-shipped therefrom and conveyed by sea direct to the ports or places of Newcastle-on-Tyne, North Shields, South Shields, Hartlepool, West Hartlepool, Middlesborough, or Stockton-on-Tees.

2. Provided that all cattle which shall have been so re-shipped and landed at such last-mentioned ports or places or any one of them shall be subject to all the regulations of the Lords of the Council for the time being in force applicable to foreign cattle brought by sea into such port or place, with the exception of that regulation which would require them to remain twelve hours in the lairs previous to examination by the Inspector,

and with the exception of that regulation which would require them to be inspected by an Inspector at such last-mentioned ports or places, or any one of them, as provided by the said Order of the twenty-seventh day of May last.

3. The words herein contained shall be construed as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and all the provisions therein contained, relative to the offences for the contravention thereof, and the penalty for the same, and in respect of the powers of officers employed under it, and all other provisions of that Order, and the subsequent Orders altering it, now in force, and not inconsistent with anything herein contained, shall in respect of every matter and thing to which they shall be applicable, apply to the Regulations contained in this Order, and the enforcing the same, and the officers employed under it.

4. And the said Lords do further order, that the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Sunderland, shall forthwith publish this Order by causing a copy thereof to be advertised in some newspaper circulating in the said borough, and by causing a copy thereof to be affixed in some conspicuous place of the port of Sunderland.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from Her Majesty's Consul at St. Croix, a Despatch, of which the following is copy :—

St. Croix, June 24, 1867.

MY LORD,

WITH reference to my predecessor, Acting Consul Perkin's communication of 27th November, 1866, No. 18, notifying the establishment of quarantine at the ports of this Island on account of Asiatic cholera in the Island of St. Thomas, I have the honour to report to your Lordship that the epidemic having ceased, the quarantine has been abolished.

Westminster, July 15, 1867.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear*

the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to authorize the Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the borough and city of Chester and county of the same city, and the Promote and Pentice Courts for the city of Chester, to be held at the Castle of Chester, and to confer additional powers upon the Sheriff of the county of Chester, in exoneration of the Sheriff of the city of Chester.

An Act to amend and consolidate the Public Libraries Acts (Scotland).

An Act for amending the law with respect to the Accounts of the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District; and for other purposes relating to the Metropolitan Police.

An Act for the preservation of Bunhill-fields Burial Ground, in the county of Middlesex, as an open space; and for other purposes relating thereto.

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited for all purposes as "The Worcester, Dean Forest, and Monmouth Railway (Deviation) Certificate, 1867."

Promoters.

2. The Worcester, Dean Forest, and Monmouth Railway Company are the Promoters of the deviation, and are hereinafter referred to as "the Company."

Purchase of Lands for extraordinary purposes.

3. The Company from time to time may purchase by agreement, in addition to the lands already contracted for, any quantity of land not exceeding five acres, which the Company require for any of the extraordinary purposes specified in "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845."

Power to make and maintain Deviation Railway and Works.

4. The Company may, on the lands purchased by them, make and maintain the deviation railway and works shown on the deposited plans and sections, in the lines and according to the levels and within the limits of deviation shown on those plans and sections as altered by the direction of the Board of Trade.

Description of Deviation Railway.

5. Compensation for Damage to Land by Entry, &c., for purpose of abandoned Line.

Short Title.

Interpretation.

2. In this Certificate the expression, "The Company," shall mean the Barry Railway Company.

The expression, "The Barry Railway," shall mean the authorized Barry Railway.

The expression, "The Harbour Company," shall mean the Barry Harbour Company.

Power to make Railway.

3. The Company may, on lands purchased by them, make and maintain in the line, and according to the levels, and within the limits of deviation shewn on the deposited plans and sections, the railway and works shewn on the deposited plans and sections, as altered by the direction of the Board of Trade, such authorized Railway being the following (that is to say):—

A railway one mile four furlongs and one hundred and eighty-five yards or thereabouts in length, commencing by a junction with the Barry Railway, in the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, in the county of Glamorgan, and terminating upon Barry Island, in the parish of Sully, in the same county.

8. Two pounds a share shall be the greatest amount of a Call, and three months, at least, shall be the interval between successive Calls, and two-thirds of the amount of a share shall be the utmost aggregate amount of the Calls made in any one year upon any share.

New Shares raised under this Certificate or any Act of this Session may be of the same Class.

9. If by any Act passed in the present session of Parliament, whether before or after the issuing of this Certificate, the Company be authorized to raise any capital by new shares, then subject to the provisions of such Act and this Certificate respectively, the Company, if they think fit, may raise, by the creation and issue of new shares of one and the same class, all or any part of the aggregate Capital which they are by such Act and this Certificate respectively authorized to raise by the creation and issue of new shares.

Existing Mortgages to have priority.

12. All mortgages granted by the Company in pursuance of the powers of any Act or Acts of Parliament before the issuing of this Certificate, and which shall be subsisting when this Certificate comes into operation, shall, during the continuance of such mortgages, have priority over any mortgages to be granted by virtue of this Certificate.

Tolls, &c.

13. The Company may demand and take in respect of the Railway the same tolls and charges as by "The Barry Railway Act, 1865" they are empowered to take in respect of the Barry Railway. And all the provisions and enactments contained in that Act relative to the said tolls and charges shall apply to any tolls and charges to be taken under this Certificate.

Railway forms part of Company's undertaking.

14. Save and except so far as may be inconsistent with "The Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864," the Railway shall be, for all

purposes whatever, a part of the undertaking of the Company as fully as if it had been authorized by the Act of 1865, or by any subsequent Act or Acts relating to the Company.
