Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to accept the resignation of the Commission held by Lieutenant James Douglas Vaughan Allen in the Forfar and Kincardine Artillery Militia.

Her Majesty's Commissioners of Lieutenancy for the City of London have been pleased to accept the resignation of the Commission held by Lieutenant Newton Edward Jennings in the Royal London Militia. Dated 17th July, 1867.

The Right Honourable Sir William Bovill, Knt., Lord Chief Justice of Her Majesty's Court of Common Pleas, at Westminster, has appointed William Clarke, of No. 29, Coleman-street, in the city of London, Gentleman, to be one of the Perpetual Commissioners for taking the acknowledgments of deeds to be executed by married women, under the Act passed for the abolition of fines and recoveries, and for the substitution of

more simple modes of assurance, in and for the city of London, also in and for the county of Middlesex, and city and liberties of Westminster.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having certified to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, in pursuance of the Act 29 and 30 Vict., cap. 39, sec. 16, that the actual surplus revenue of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, beyond the actual expenditure thereof, for the year ended the 31st day of March, 1867, amounted to the sum of two million two hundred and four thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds seventeen shillings and three pence.

The Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt hereby give notice, that the sum of five hundred and fifty-one thousand and forty-two pounds nineteen shillings and three pence, being one-fourth part of the said surplus of two million two hundred and four thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds seventeen shillings and three pence, will be applied under the provisions of the said Act, in the quarter ending the 30th day of September, 1867, towards the reduction of the National Debt.
