AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 29th day of July, 1867.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT.

Lord Robert Montagu.
Mr. Hammond.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, duly issued under the authority of the Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," which Act has been continued until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, by various statutes, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, it was ordered, that no market, fair, auction, exhibition, or sale of cattle, should be held until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, with this exception, that markets might be held, with the licence of the Privy Council, for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter; and by a subsequent Order of the said Council, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the time limited in the said first-mentioned Order was extended until the Lords of the Council should otherwise order:

And whereas by an Order of the said Council, bearing date the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, reciting, among other things, the said regulation, it is ordered that, from and after the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, markets may be held, with the licence of the Lords of the said Council, for the sale of animals, whether intended for immediate slaughter or otherwise, in any county in England and Wales, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless their Lordships shall be satisfied that no case of cattle plague has occurred in the county

where such market is to be held, within one calendar month prior to the date of such licence, nor unless the market is situated at a distance exceeding ten miles from any place declared to be infected according to the provisions of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; and in such recited Order of the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, it is provided that no licence shall be granted under that Order permitting any market to be held in any port or other place into which animals are imported from any country not part of the United Kingdom:

And whereas by another Order of the said Council, bearing date the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, reciting, among other things, the said recited Order of the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the holding of markets with the licence of the Lords of the said Council, for the sale of animals, otherwise than for immediate slaughter, at any port or other place in England or Wales into which animals may be imported from any country not part of the United Kingdom was authorized: but it was provided that in ports or places in which licences to hold such markets as aforesaid should be granted, no cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man should be landed, except at some part of such port or place to be defined in some Order or Orders of the Lords of the Council, nor until some such Order or Orders shall have been so made, and that when landed, they should not be moved from such part of such port or place, except to be taken to the nearest shed or slaughter-house in such port or place which should have been duly licensed by the Lords of Her Majesty's Council for the reception or slaughter of foreign cattle, and it was ordered that they should be there slaughtered within four days from the day of landing, both days inclusive:

And whereas the port of Dartmouth, in the county of Devon, is a port into which animals have been and can be imported from countries not parts of the United Kingdom, and it is advisable to make provision for the same as hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do, by this their Order, set forth and define the part of the said port at which cattle brought by sea

from any place out of the United Kingdom, may be landed, in manner following, that is to say :—

All that quay, wharf, or landing-place, situate on the river Dart, in the southern part of the parish of Totnes, and bounded on the north by a timber-yard in the occupation of George Caunter; on the east by the river Dart; on the south by Tooleys Marsh; and on the west by a private road belonging to the said quay and marsh, and on a portion of which a shed is erected for the reception and slaughter of foreign cattle :

And the said Lords do hereby further order, that all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, so landed at the port of Dartmouth, shall be slaughtered within such part of the said port as defined as aforesaid, and not elsewhere; and that no cattle brought within such part of the said port shall be removed therefrom alive :

And further, that all the regulations of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, now in force, and not inconsistent herewith, shall apply to this Order; and that any contravention of any provision herein contained shall be deemed to be an offence within the operation of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and be punishable as therein provided :

And further, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Dartmouth, shall publish this Order by causing a copy thereof to be advertised in some newspaper circulating in the said borough, and by causing a copy thereof to be affixed in some conspicuous place of the port aforesaid.

Marine Board of Health.—(No. 21.)

THE Minister of the Interior, on account of information received of the appearance of Cholera in other maritime communes of the Province of Palermo, decrees, that the fowl bills which were ordered by No. 17, of July, to be supplied to ships leaving the Gulf of Palermo, will be extended to-day to all those coming from the harbours of the Province which are stated to be infected.

Marine Board of Health.—(No. 22.)

ON account of the appearance of Cholera in various maritime communes of Sicily, and specially in Castellamare del Golfo, Castelvetro, Terranova, Vittoria, Scaglitti, Augusta, and San Stefano Camastra, the Minister of the Interior decrees, that from this day fowl bills of health will be issued from the harbours of the Gulf of Castellamare, of the Gulf of the Coast of the Province of Trapani included between Cape Felò and the

Province of Giugenti, those between the confines of the Province of Catania and Syracuse, with the exclusion of this latter port, and finally, the territory between the Province of Palermo and Saint Agathe di Militello, this harbour excluded.

The ships leaving that part of the coast shall be subjected, on their arrival at other ports of the Kingdom, to fifteen days of quarantine, and to all the other provisions of the Decree of the 29th April past.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to explain the operation of an Act passed in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to the administration of deceased persons."

An Act for the appointment of a stipendiary magistrate for Chatham and Sheerness, in the county of Kent.

An Act to abolish a certain declaration, commonly called the Declaration against Transubstantiation, the Invocation of the Saints, and the Sacrifice of the Mass, as practised in the Church of Rome; and to render it unnecessary to take, make, or subscribe the same as a qualification for the exercise or enjoyment of any civil office, franchise, or right.

An Act to make further provision for the despatch of business in the Court of Appeal in Chancery.

An Act to confirm certain provisional orders made under an Act of the fifteenth year of Her

present Majesty, to facilitate arrangements for the relief of turnpike trusts.
