WHEREAS an Order was made by the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the twentieth day of August last, containing, amongst other things, regulations with respect to the landing of foreign cattle in England and Wales :

And whereas similar regulations are contained in another Order of the said Lords, bearing date the eleventh day of September instant, with respect to the landing of foreign cattle in Scotland :

And whereas it was provided in each of such Orders that such regulations should come into operation from and after the thirtieth day of September instant :

And whereas it is expedient that the date at which such regulations were to come into operation should be postponed until the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said regulations contained in the aforesaid Orders of the twentieth day of August last, and the eleventh day of September instant, with respect to the landing of foreign cattle in England and Wales, and in Scotland respectively; shall come into operation and be in force from and after the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven; but, until the coming into force of the said regulations, all regulations relative to the landing of foreign cattle at any port, in force at the date of this Order, shall remain in force notwithstanding anything in the aforesaid Orders, or in this Order, contained.
