THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from Her Majesty's Consul at Dantzig, a Despatch, of which the following is a copy :—

*British Consulate,
Dantzig, October 3, 1867.*

I HAVE the honour to report to your Lordship that the restrictions which had been enacted twelve months ago as to the importation of cattle, hides, &c., by sea, owing to the existence of the rinderpest in Holland and Great Britain have recently been done away with.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, a Notice, of which the following is a translation, which has been issued by the Portuguese Government :—

THE Board of Health of the Kingdom makes known that the ports of Belgium are considered infected with the cholera since the 21st instant.
