THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Pará, a Despatch, of which the following is a translation:—

*British Consulate,  
Pará, September 8, 1867.*

I HAVE the honour to inform your Lordship that the act of opening the navigation of the River Amazon to the merchant shipping of all nations was yesterday solemnly performed by the President of this Province, the Admiral de Lamare, who proceeded for that purpose, on board a Brazilian frigate, to the mouth of the Amazon, accompanied by all the principal functionaries, foreign consuls, and inhabitants of this city.

The ceremony was attended with great pomp,

and public festivities on a large scale are being held in honour of the event.

The non-arrival of any foreign man-of-war on this occasion has been much regretted by the Brazilian authorities and inhabitants of Pará.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, enclosing copy and translation of a Royal Order, bearing date 18th October, 1867, which decrees that machines, tools, apparatus, and foreign contrivances designed for purposes of agriculture shall pay a duty of one per cent. ad valorem (instead of six per cent. hitherto levied), under the national flag, and one-fifth more under foreign flags.
