Masters and commanders of vessels who shall be unable to enter in their reports or manifests a true specification of all goods imported in their respective vessels, in consequence of their neglect or failure to obtain a full and detailed description of all such goods in their bills of lading, before the shipment of such goods, will be liable to the penalties laid down in the 34th section of the above-mentioned Act.
