The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

The lighthouse is rectangular, and 20 feet high; its' position is in lat. 38° 28' 41" N., long. 14° 57' 30" East of Greenwich.

This light is intended as a guide to Casa Bianca anchorage.

# Alteration of Harbour Light at Fiume.

The Austrian Government has given notice, that the following alteration will shortly take place in the harbour light at Fiume, Gulf of Quarnero.

Instead of the present harbour light, a light will be exhibited from the extremity of the mole, now in the course of construction.

The light is a *fixed* light, showing white between the bearings of North to West, and *red* between the bearings North to East, elevated 26 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of seven miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by enses.

The light is exhibited from an iron column, 25 feet high, and its position is in lat. 45°  $19\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 14° 26' East of Greenwich.

During very stormy weather the light will not be exhibited.
