LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER APPROVING OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF ALLERTON, IN THE COUNTY OF LANCASTER.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the 16th day of November, 1867, passed by the township of Allerton, in the county of Lancaster; and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act: And whereas it has now been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been duly advertised, and that copies have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in the district, to which notices are usually affixed, and

the period fixed by the said Act for appeal has now expired, and no such appeal has been made: And whereas although the said township is a place with a population of less than 3000 by the last census, it has appeared to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that by reason of the special circumstances it is expedient that the said township should be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption by the township aforesaid; and do further order that such Act shall, at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution, have the force of law within such township of Allerton.
