IN THE MATTER OF THE FACTORY ACTS EXTENSION ACT, 1867.

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me the undersigned, Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the Trades carried on in the Factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the children, young persons, and women, working in such Factories, should be employed between the hours hereinafter mentioned, now I, the said Gathorne Hardy, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Twelfth Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do by this order give permission to the occupiers of the said Factories to employ the children, young persons, and women, working in such Factories, between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening, or between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening, instead of between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, subject to the conditions in the said Act mentioned.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE PARISH OF TWICKENHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MID-

SEWAGE UTILIZATION ACTS, 1865 and 1867.

ORDER SETTLING BOUNDARIES OF A SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT OF EPPING.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867 (30 and 31 Vict., cap. 113), that any inhabited place not having a known or defined boundary may petition one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in manner provided in the sixteenth section of the Local Government Act, 1858, to settle its boundaries for the purposes of the Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867, and the Secretary of State may, by Order made in manner provided by the said section, settle the same accordingly, and from and after the date of such Order the place shall be deemed to have been constituted a special drainage district for the purposes of the said Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867; and whereas it is further provided that a copy of the Order of the Secretary of State shall be published in manner provided by the seventh section of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and that section shall be construed in reference to a special drainage district formed under this section as if the Order of the said Secretary of State were substituted for "Resolution of a Sewer Authority;" and whereas, in pursuance of such provisions, a Memorial has been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from inhabitant ratepayers of the town of Epping, in the county of Essex, such town being a place not having a known or defined boundary, praying that it should be constituted into a special drainage district for such town of Epping, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts; and whereas due investigation has been made into the circumstances of the case,
