WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of certain land with a dwelling-house and out-offices thereon, which has been permanently secured to the perpetual curacy of Saint Mary, Bungay, in the county of Suffolk, and in the diocese of Norwich, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Saint Mary, Bungay, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of forty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common 'fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every
