**IN THE MATTER OF THE FACTORY ACTS
EXTENSION ACTS, 1867.**

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the Trades carried on in the Factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the modifications hereafter mentioned should be allowed, now, I, the said Gathorne Hardy, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the twenty-fifth Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do, by this my order, give permission to the occupiers of the said Factories:—

That the eight half holidays or four whole holidays may be given to the children, young persons, or women, or any one or more of them, at different times, provided that notice of the holiday be given at least one day previously.

That children, young persons, or women may be employed between two P.M. and eight P.M. on Saturdays, provided a full half holiday be given on some day in the ensuing week, such day to be named on the Saturday.

That a Surgical Certificate granted by a Certifying Surgeon be valid at any Factory in the district of the same Certifying Surgeon, provided the occupier in whose Factory the child or young person named in the certificate is employed endorse the certificate and pass it to the next employer of the said child or young person.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

(21 and 22, Vict., cap. 98.)

EYE (BOROUGH), COUNTY SUFFOLK.—NOTICE AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION RESCINDING THE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ACT IN THAT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted by the district of the borough of Eye, in the county of Suffolk, on the 26th day of September, 1866, and a resolution has been subsequently on the 20th day of December, 1867, passed by the Council of the said borough, on a requisition of ratepayers of such borough rescinding the previous resolution adopting the said Act, and no appeal has been presented to any one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, under the provisions of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1863 (sec. 4), against such rescinding resolution. And whereas, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have taken the circumstances of the case into full consideration, I do hereby approve the aforesaid resolution rescinding the previous resolution adopting the Local Government Act, 1858, within the said district of the borough of Eye, in the county of Suffolk; and further order that, from the date of the publication of this present notice in the London Gazette, the adoption of the said Local Government Act, shall be deemed to be avoided and that, from the same date, the Local Government Act, 1858, shall cease to be in force within the said district of the borough of Eye, and such borough shall revert to the position in which it was before the adoption of the said Act; so, nevertheless, that all contracts that may have been entered into by or on behalf of the Local Board thereof, may be enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Local Government Act, 1858, had continued in force, and, so far as may be necessary for the enforcement of such contracts, such Local Board and all their powers of levying money shall be deemed to be and shall be continued as provided by the aforesaid Acts.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 6.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—GULF OF NAPLES.

Revolving Light on Carena Point, Capri Island.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 10th day of December, 1867, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse on Carena Point, Capri Island.

The light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every two minutes; it is elevated 246 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The lighthouse is 59 feet high, adjoining the keeper's dwelling, and its position is in lat. 40° 32' 8" N., long. 14° 11' 47" East of Greenwich. The light is intended as a guide for entering the Gulf of Naples.
