WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Edenhall with the perpetual curacy of Langwathby, annexed, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said

land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Edenhall, with the perpetual curacy of Langwathby annexed, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of eight pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage of Edenhall-with-Langwathby, one capital sum of one thousand and four hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Edenhall-with-Langwathby: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of eight pounds, firstly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
