

4. The prohibition of importation, sale, and manufacture in Russia extends to toys of all sorts, painted with arsenical colours, as well as covers made of paper tinted with the same colours, which are used for wrapping or ornamenting bonbons, and other confectionery and provisions.

5. Colours other than arsenical colours but which are more or less injurious shall not be employed in painting toys unless mixed with oil.

6. The employment of any substance injurious to health to colour provisions and confectioneries such as bonbons, gingerbreads, marmelade, preserves, ices, &c., &c., is entirely forbidden.
