

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Penrith, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same benefice, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments with its appurtenances, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with its appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same benefice shall be entitled to receive from us or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with its appurtenances, as from the twenty-third day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

All that part, parcel, or division of the wastes in and upon Sleagill Common, in the parish of Morland, in the county of Westmoreland, lately allotted by Act of Parliament, as and for an equivalent and compensation for the tithe corn of the township of Sleagill, within the said parish of Morland, containing by admeasurement ninety-one acres (be the same more or less), having the old inclosures of Kingsmeaburn on or towards the east, the allotment of the Vicar of Morland for the time being in part, and the high road leading from Morland to Maulsmeaburn in other part, on or towards the west, the land of the said Dean and Chapter on or towards the north, and the road leading from Sleagill aforesaid to Appleby on or towards the south.
