REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be

submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto John Arthur Henry Moore, Esquire, a Major in the Army, eldest son and heir of John Arthur Moore, late a Lieutenant in the Royal Navy, deceased, who was the second son of John Moore, of New Lodge, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, by Barbara his wife, only surviving daughter of William Brabazon, commonly called the Honourable William Brabazon, a younger son of Edward, Earl of Meath, and brother of Anthony, also Earl of Meath, of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a condition contained in a certain deed of settlement, take and assume the surname of Brabazon, in addition to and after that of Moore, and that he and they may bear the arms of Brabazon; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said Royal declaration and concession be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Teneriffe, reporting that from the 11th February last, by an order of the Government at Madrid, the navigation and port dues, established by the Royal Decree of 17th December, 1851, have been imposed upon Spanish and foreign vessels entering the ports of the Canary Islands, in which artificial works have been constructed. All vessels therefore entering the ports of Santa Cruz Teneriffe, Las Palmas, Grand Canary, Santa Cruz de la Palma, and Arecife Lancerote, are required to pay, in addition to the port and sanitary dues heretofore levied, one real vallon per registered ton on anchoring, and one-eighth of a real vallon for every quintal of goods landed and shipped. The anchorage duty, however, is levied only at the first port entered for the purpose of transacting any commercial operations.

The Civil Governor of the Islands has forwarded to the Spanish Government a petition from the Provincial Board of Commerce, against the imposition of these dues; and, pending the decision of the Government, has ordered the amount levied to be received as a deposit, which will be returned to the owners or consignees of the vessels which have paid them, should the order be rescinded.
