sentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

The above charges apply to all vessels of upwards of 40 lasts (60 tons); those of less burden pay only a half.

All river dues and tolls for passing draw-bridges are reduced by one-half.

Ships calling for orders, or in search of freight, are in future free from port charges.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, an extract from the Moniteur containing an Imperial Decree, relative to the lowering of the Tariffs on the transport of cereals; as well as a notice of the Minister of Commerce on the same subject.

The Articles of the Decree, dated 14th March, 1868, are as follows :—

ART. 1. Railway Companies who shall lower their tariffs for the transport of corn, wheat-flour, rye-flour, buck-wheat and rye, prior to the 1st April, 1868, shall have the power of raising them again, within the maximum limit authorized by the conditions, without waiting for the expiration of the legal delay of one year. The duration, however, of the tariffs thus lowered, shall not be less than four months.

ART. 2. The Companies shall not be compelled to make use of any formality, such as posting notices previous to the application of the reduced rates; but they must give the public notice, by means of notices, one week beforehand, when they wish to raise the duties again after the expiration of the four months above mentioned.

Accessory Expenses.

1. Registration 10 centimes per journey.

The charges of the present general tariff shall only be applicable, provided that the sender shall have made an express demand to that effect in his declaration. In default of this previous demand, the transport shall be subjected, in respect of duty, to the charges and conditions of the tariff usually in force with the several Companies.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular issued, 17th December last, by the Zollverein Minister of Finance, of which the following is a translation :—

According to the regulations on page 359 of the official catalogue of goods, silk, or floss-silk goods mixed with cotton linen, wool, and other hairs of animals (Thierhaaren) coming under the category No. 41 of the Customs Tariff, but without admixture of metal thread as half silk goods coming under the category No. 130 of the Tariff have to pay duty amounting to 30 thalers per centner. Accordingly, all textures which contain silk, be it ever so little, will be considered as half silk goods. Hereto belong especially stuffs in which yarn is used, spun from refuse silk and other materials.

It has lately been determined by the Federal Council of the North German Confederation and the Governments of the Southern States of the Zollverein to introduce a limitation in regard to half silk goods, and

That silks in which yarns of other woven materials are employed is to be left out of consideration in fixing a tariff of tissues made from such yarns in return for which tissues in which silk is carried through the threads of the tissue as a connected thread, or in which silk forms the envelopement of a thread of other spinning material are further also to be considered as half silk goods.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 23.)—ENGLAND—WEST COAST.—BRISTOL CHANNEL.

*Addition and Alteration of Buoys, &c.*

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that in the month of April next it is their intention to place the following additional buoys in the Bristol Channel, viz. :—

*Entrance to Milford Haven.*

A can buoy, coloured *red and white striped*, will be placed to cover the two fathoms patches on the west side of the eastern channel into Milford Haven.

*Channels inside the Scarweather Sand.*

In consequence of the changes which have taken place in the Hugo Channel, the Shord and Kenfig Channels will be buoyed as follows, viz. :—

A *black* can buoy will be placed on the north side of the Scarweather Middle, and a *chequered black and white* can buoy will be placed on the south edge of the Hugo Bank. A conical *black* buoy will be placed on the shoal N.E. of the Hugo Bank.

The present Hugo Bank buoy will be discontinued.

*The Nash Sand.*

The Nash swatchway buoy will be removed one mile to the westward, and will be a can buoy coloured *red and white in vertical stripes*.

A new can buoy will be placed to the southward of the Nash Middle, and will be *chequered red and white*.

*King Road.*

A can buoy, coloured *red and white in vertical stripes*, will be placed on the west end of the Newcome Shoal.

A *red* conical buoy will be placed to the northward of the Firefly Rock.

A *red* can buoy will be placed to the north of the Flatness Rocks.

The Cockburn buoy will be painted *red and white, chequered*.

A strip (or streak) of *green* light will be shown from the Avon lighthouse from between the bearings E.S.E. and E. by S. to facilitate the navigation of the river by night.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variations 22° Westerly in 1868.]

*Fixed Light at Cochin.*

THE Marine Department at Madras has given notice, that from the 15th day of January, 1868, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Cochin, Malabar coast.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 95 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is 89 feet high, built of white stone, and its position is in lat. 9° 57' 50" N., long. 76° 14' 40" east from Greenwich.

This light is substituted for the one formerly shown from the flagstaff.

*Anchorage.*—The best anchorage in Cochin Roads is with the following bearings, viz. :—Lighthouse from E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. to E. by S., 2 to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles off shore in from 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms, soft ground.
