THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Manila, reporting that by a Royal Decree, dated Madrid 10th December, 1867, the following articles have been declared free of duty on importation into the Philippine Islands without any distinction as to flag, namely, -olive oil, rice, bacalao, salted and dried meats, beef and mutton, hams and venison, peas, grains, vegetables and cereals such as oats, rye, beans, maize, lentils, and the like, flour, green herbs, garlic, onions, potatoes, butter and lard, salted, dried, and pickled fish, sardines, hung beef, bacon, wheat, cattle, pigs and buffaloes, trees, plants and seeds, coals, and live fish.
