## A PROCLAMATION

For the putting in Execution the Laws and Statutes of this Real n, for the preventing the Exportation of Sheep, Wooll, Wooll-fells, Woollen-yain, Mort-lings, Shorlings, Wooll flocks, Fullers-Earth, and Fulling-Clay, out of this Kingdom.
