THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the part of the Port of Goole, in the West Riding of the county of York, within which foreign cattle may be landed, as follows:-

All that space in the Port of Goole included within a line commencing at a point one hundred and thirty-nine feet from the viaduct of the Mineral Line, and one hundred and forty feet from the west-side of the Railway Dock, thence continuing in an easterly direction for a distance of eighty feet to a point sixty feet from the said dock, thence in a southerly direction for one hundred feet running for that length parallel with the western face of the said dock to a point sixty feet distant therefrom, thence in an easterly direction for sixty feet where it reaches the said dock, thence in a southerly direction for thirty-seven feet along the western face of the said dock, thence along the north side of the viaduct of the said Mineral Line for a distance of eighty-five feet, thence for a distance of thirty-nine feet in a northerly direction parallel to the western face of the said dock, and eighty-five feet therefrom, thence continuing for a distance of fifty-five feet in a westerly direction, parallel with the said viaduct, and thirty-nine feet therefrom, thence for a distance of one hundred feet in a northerly direction, and parallel to the western face of the said dock, to the point first mentioned; all which space is coloured green on the plan of part of the Port of Goole deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York;

And do hereby prescribe as follows:-

- 1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within that defined part, within ten days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing.
- 2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.
