TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, the following translations of an Order of the Russian Custom House Authorities, and of the rules to be adopted by way of experiment, as regards the presentation of bills of lading by vessels arriving at St. Petersburg and Cronstadt:—

TRANSLATION of an Order from the Customs' Department to the Custom House at St. Petersburg, dated $\frac{2}{11}$ of May, 1868.

THE Minister of Finance has ordered the following measures to be introduced at the Custom House of St. Petersburg by way of experiment, viz:—

1. The compulsory production of bills of lading by masters of vessels arriving at St. Petersburg and Cronstadt, with all the consequences that result from that regulation, shall be abolished.

2. In lieu of the bills of lading now demanded from vessels on their arrival, the presentation of manifests prepared abroad in any foreign language shall be admitted, which manifest shall supply the materials for a list of the ship's cargo.*

3. In those exceptional cases where the vessel shall have no manifest on board, the regulations at present in force respecting bills of lading, &c., shall continue applicable.

RULES introduced by way of experiment at the Custom Houses of St. Petersburg and Cronstadt, in consequence of the abolition of the compulsory presentation of Bills of Lading on the part of Masters of Vessels.

1. For steamers and sailing vessels discharging at Cronstadt, and forwarding their cargoes to St. Petersburg in lighters:—

On the arrival of such steamers or vessels, the Custom House officers at Cronstadt shall take from the master the ship's manifest in one copy, and make two copies of it in the Russian language, according to the accompanying form.

The original manifest and one copy shall be forwarded without delay to the Custom House of St. Petersburg, while the second copy shall be retained at the Custom House of Cronstadt until the cargo of the steamer or sailing vessel shall have been finally discharged into lighters. As

soon as the cargo shall have been completely discharged, the second copy of the manifest shall likewise be forwarded to the Custom House at St. Petersburg, and referred to the Shipping Office, for the purpose of checking the packages of goods discharged with the lighter notes (or passes) of the lighters which shall have received the cargo of the steamer or sailing vessel.

The goods discharged by the lighters at St. Petersburg shall be checked by the lighter notes (or passes), and an acknowledgment of their receipt in the warehouse shall be made on such lighter notes or passes.

The arrangements for warehousing the goods shall be made on the strength of the first copy of the manifest sent from Cronstadt.

2. For steamers or sailing vessels discharging a portion of their cargoes at Cronstadt and proceeding with the rest to St. Petersburg town.

The foregoing rules shall be equally applicable to vessels discharging a portion of their cargoes at Cronstadt, with the difference, however, that the second copy of the Manifest shall not be transmitted separately after the vessel shall have been lightened, but shall be placed in a sealed envelope, which shall be entrusted to the Master for presentation to the Custom House at St. Petersburg on his arrival there; and an inscription shall be made on such copy of the Manifest, showing the number of packages remaining on board.

3. For steamers and sailing vessels proceeding direct to St. Petersburg town without unloading or transshipping any portion of their cargo at Cronstadt.

On the arrival of such steamers or sailing vessels at St. Petersburg, the Custom House officers shall take from them a single copy of the ship's manifest, and make two copies of it in the Russian language according to the accompanying form.

The original manifest shall be retained at the Custom-house, and one of the copies shall be sent to the "Warehousing Office" and the other to the "Shipping Office," for the purpose of checking the discharge and receipt of the cargo.

In each of the three cases above stated, in addition to the ship's manifest, a "Deposition" (report) shall be taken from the master in which the latter shall be bound to show the quantity of ship's provisions on board, and such goods as he may have brought for sale on his own account, as well as all such other packages of merchandize as may be on board, although not entered in the manifest. After the cargo of a vessel shall have been finally discharged, an endorsement shall be made to that effect on the two copies of the manifest severally in the Shipping and Warehousing Office, and the two copies shall thereupon be transmitted to the Custom-house.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Brindisi, the Despatch, of which the following is copy, regarding the regulations in force as to the luggage of passengers arriving at Brindisi:—

*British Consulate,
Brindisi, May 11, 1868*

I HAVE the honour to report to you that the Director of the Custom-house at this port has informed me that he has received instructions

from the Minister of Finance to the effect that the examination of passengers luggage is, for the future, to be performed on board the steamers and with the greatest possible expedition.

This measure will greatly facilitate the transit of passengers through this port, as a great deal of time has hitherto been lost in conveying the luggage to the Custom-house for examination, and the minuteness with which the same was gone through, often causing travellers to miss the express train to Bologna.

And also to enquire into and consider the legal condition of persons being aliens, entering into or residing within the realm, and becoming naturalized as subjects of the Crown, and to report how far and in what manner it may be expedient, having regard to the laws and practice of England, of Foreign States, or otherwise, to alter or amend the laws relating to such persons, or persons claiming rights or privileges through or under them.

The Queen has also been pleased to appoint Charles Stuart Aubrey Abbott, Esq., to be Secretary to the Commission.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore, it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—
