Revolving Light on Delamara Point.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 20, dated 7th March, 1868, respecting the temporary discontinuance of Delamara light, Marsa Scirocco bay, south-east coast of Malta:

Notice is hereby given, that from the 1st day of July, 1868, the light will be re-established.

The light is a revolving light, showing a red and a white face or flash alternately every half minute elevated 151 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles: it is visible through an arc of 270 degrees or from between the bearings S.W. by S. (S. 35° W.) and S.E. by E. (S. 55° E.)

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by

lenses, of the third order.

The tower is 72 feet high, octagonal in shape, and rises from the centre of the keeper's dwelling, which is a rectangular stone building; its position is in lat. 35° 49" 40" N., long. 14° 34' East from Greenwich.
