From Bridlington we are told, that a small Veffel belonging to Lyn was put on shoar within 2 miles of that place, and that great flore of veffels are seen passing to and fro upon the Coal-Trade, and that 60 fail of laden thips passing through that Road the 5 thinstant, were by stress of weather forced off to lea, some of them with much difficulty and danger recovering the Bay, with the loss of many of their Anchors and Gabels.

Plymouth, Feb 7. The Two French men of War that were forced to put in here by foul weather, which leparated them from the reft of their Squadron, on Weinelday laft put out again to lea to purfue their former intentions of fecuring their Coafts from the Offenders and other Privateer. Yesterday a thip belonging to Lime intending for Virginis, sher having spent some days at lea, was by contrary winds driven into this Harbor.
