THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at San José, reporting that by a decree of the 23rd June last the export duty in Costa Rica on coffee of fifty cents (two shillings) per quintal (one hundred pounds) is abolished, and the same duty is imposed on flour and cereals imported. The law is to come into operation on the 1st of December next.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore, it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PART OF ACT BY THE FLEETWOOD (LANCASHIRE) COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners acting under and by virtue of the Fleetwood Paving, Lighting, Watching, &c., Improvement Act (5 Vic., sess 2, cap. 49), did, on the 10th day of August, 1868, adopt part of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the district of the said Commissioners, that is to say, section 77 of the Local Government Act, 1858, aforesaid:

And whereas notice of such adoption of the said portion of that Act has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby give notice, that the hereinbefore described portion of the said recited Act has been adopted within the district of the aforesaid Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners; and that in accordance with the Local Government Act, 1858, the said portion of the hereinbefore recited Act will, from the date of the notice to me of the adoption thereof, have the force of law within the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners' District aforesaid.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 72.)—ADRIATIC—TREMITI ISLANDS.

Fixed Light on Caprara Island.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 25th day of July, 1868, a new light would be exhibited from a lighthouse on the east end of Caprara, Tremiti islands.

The light is a *fixed* white light, visible through an arc of $258\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$, or from between the bearings S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., easterly (S. $65\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.), round by south and west to N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. (N. 13° E.) Also through an arc of $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ in the direction of the

anchorage and channel formed by the islands of St. Niccola, Cretaccio, and S. Domino. It is elevated 118 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is octagonal in shape, white, and attached to the keeper's dwelling, which is coloured yellow.

(No. 73.)—NORTH SEA—SLESVIG HOLSTEIN.

Light Vessel off the Mouth of the Eider River.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 27, dated 21st March, 1868, respecting a light vessel then about to be stationed westward of the mouth of the Eider River.

The Prussian Government has given further notice, that the light vessel has been placed in position, and the light exhibited.

The light vessel is moored in 7 fathoms water, with the following bearings, viz.:—

Outer Elbe light vessel ... S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

Eider light and Pilot vessel ... E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.

South Hever beacon buoy ... E. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.

Helgoland lighthouse ... W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.,

and her position is in lat. $54^{\circ} 15' 50''$ N., long. $8^{\circ} 17' 30''$ East from Greenwich.

The following description is from the previous Notice:—

The light is exhibited from the mainmast of the light vessel, and elevated 35 feet above the level of the sea.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The light vessel is painted black, with the name *Eider* in white on each side, and has three masts with a black ball at each mast head.

In misty or foggy weather a bell will be sounded, and ships approaching the Eider shoals on a wrong course will be warned by signal guns.

The light vessel will remain in both summer and winter, and will only be removed when forced to do so by floating ice; if under these circumstances the vessel is not in position, the light will not be exhibited, and a black flag with a white square will be hoisted at the mizen.

Alteration in position of the Eider Light and Pilot Vessel at the Mouth of the Eider River.

Also, that the position of the light and pilot vessel at the mouth of the Eider River has been altered.

She now lies in $3\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, with the following bearings, viz.:—

St. Peter's Church E.N.E.

Blanort beacon... .. S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.,

and her position is in lat. $54^{\circ} 15' 37''$ N., long. $8^{\circ} 32' 44''$ E.

The above light vessels and the beacon buoy laid

down between them are in a line, bearing E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. and W. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 17° Westerly in 1868.]

(No. 74.)—NORTH SEA—JUTLAND.

New Channel to Limfjord.

THE Agger channel into Limfjord has become unnavigable, but a new channel nearly one and a quarter miles further to the south of it, called *Tyboron*, has been formed; this channel has from $6\frac{1}{2}$ to 7 feet in it at high water.
