Sunken Rocks in San Lorenzo Channel.

NOTICE is hereby given of a patch of sunken rocks recently discovered in San Lorenzo Channel, Gulf of California, by the officers of H.M.S. Scout.

The rocky patch, with from 9 to 12 feet water, named Scout Shoal, lies nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the south-east shores of the channel, with the following bearings, viz.:—

The centre of a gap next South of
the highest peaks of Ceralbo Island E. by S.
Eastern extreme of Espirito Santo - N. ½ E.
North Rock (breakers) - - N. ½ E.
The highest land on the Californian shore just
open N.E. of a peculiar red mound on Dispensa point, or southern end of Espirito
Santo.

These bearings place it W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Arranco Cabella point, and N. $\frac{1}{3}$ W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from San Lorenzo point.

Discoloured water extends some distance to the northward of the patch, but not less than $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms could be found.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Tavolara Island.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of September, 1868, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently constructed on the north-east end of Tavolara Island, south side of Gulf of Terranova.

The light is a fixed and flashing white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. It is elevated 540 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 30 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.
