Flashing Light on Tortuga Point, Coquimbo.

THE Chilian Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Tortuga Point, the south point of Coquimbo Bay.

The light is a *flashing* white light showing a flash of *five seconds* duration every *fifteen seconds*, the partial eclipse lasting *ten seconds*; it is elevated 106 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.
