A s we, not long fince, profermed our falves at Your Royal Feet, with our most humble and unsergned Thanks for Tour late Royal Declaration of Indulgence, so we are none come to render our begatty Thanks to Your Sucred Majesty, for Your more particular and special Favour towards us, in admitting us to a share of Your Majesties Government in this Your Borough, which, with the greatest Faithfulness and Duty to Your Majesty, we shall endeavour to discharge. And the Glory of Your Majesties Favours so much the more relotends sawards us, we as much vours so much the more resplents sewards in, in as much as we cannot be so immediately serviceable to Your Majesties Gracious Incentions, for the good of Your Subjects expressed in Your faid Royal Declaration, being not in a Capacity to elect any Member of Parliament for the Your Borough; yet shall we not be wanting in using our utmost Endeavours to promote such Tour Majestes Gracious Inclinations; and in Prayers to Almighty God, that he will dispose the Hearts of Your Great Council in Parliament (when Yeur Majesty Shall be pleased to call one) to answer Your Majestuck Purposes for the good of Your People. That God may lengthen out Your Majesties Reign over in. and grant into Tour Majesty eternal Life and Glory in the World to come, are; and shall be, the Prayers of Your Majesties most obliged and devoted Subjects. In Testimony whereof, we have caused our Common Seal to be affixed this Seventeenth day of April, Anno Dom. 1688. And in the Fourth year of your Majellies Reign.

Venice, April 23. The Consty of which we made mention in our last is now, easy, to fail, deing composed of & great Ships, on which are arrivabled, 1400, Men of the Regiment of Marginians, and 1000 Suffers: The rest of the new Levies will be likewise best away as fait as they arrive at the Ledge The last Letters from this Levantigave an account, that the Boge Morojni had ap-polyted the general Rendezvous of the Fleet to be near Athens a and that he had distributed Arms and Ammunition among the Recole; of Negropore, upon the Affur inners they had given him; of their Refolution to caff of the Ottoman Yeke, and to gut the office under the Protection of the Republick. We are told from Dale materia, that the Jurky had made an Innocal into the Province of Zara; but that the Morlagues, who had notice of their march, had forwell received them, that many of the Bright ware killed and taken, and the rest put to flight. They write from Ragula, that they had received advice by the way of Belgrade, that the disturbances at Configuration intend of being appealed graw daily greater. That the Spahi's and Janiaries were fallen out among themselves, and that their quarrel went so far that betaking themselves to their Arms, above 2000 were killed, and many wounded; That sheir Animolities fill continue ed is and that the Sultan and his Ministers were for taken up to quiet their intestine diforders, that the preparations for the War were quita prelected; This is to confiderable news that we cannot but with some impatience expect the confirmation of it.

Florence, April 20. of The Senate of Venice have fent one of their Secretaries to congratulate their new Doge upon his Election, and to certy him the Ducal Cap, with the addition of 11 thousand Ducats to his Pention as Captain-General of their Forces in the Levants from whence he may not return without the confent of two thinds of the Great Council. The Doge according to our last advices from those parts intends to attack either Gandin or Negro-

Leghorne, April 20. The freshest Advices from the Levant confirm the former accounts we had of the great Confusion things were in at Confeantinople, And add, that the Party, which would fet up Multapha the Son of Sul-

Warfam, April 7. The Council that was affombled at Graduo being separated, haften having resolved, That the Contributions of the Ralatinates should be continued for the carrying on the War: And that another Diet should be call'd to meet, here in November next. The Court patted from thence for Montepaffs, to visit the new Church and Convent that was built there by the late Chancellor of Lithuania; after which the King intended to continue his Journey to Velue, and the Queen would return hither. It was faid that his Majesty had thoughts of going afterwards as far as Mahilon, on the Frontiers of Molcour; but that was not yet reloived on. Colonel Baranowsky, who had been feveral years a Prifoner at Caminiec, having paid his ranform, is lately come from thence, and reports, that the Tartars were drawing all their Forces together, to make a new Incursion into the Telvitories of this Crown idefigning to walte all the
