WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council did make certain provisions relating to sheep (including lambs) brought to, and landed in, Great Britain from the Continent of Europe, and in such Order it is amongst other things provided that such sheep shall, at the option of the consignee or owner of such sheep, either be kept in quarantine in some convenient place to be set apart and appointed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs for fourteen days from the time when such sheep shall have been landed, (the day of landing being counted as one of such days,) or shall within four days after they shall have been landed, (such four days being inclusive of the day of landing,) be slaughtered at the place whereto they shall be so lauded :

And whereas it is expedient that the time should be extended within which sheep, not subjected to quarantine, are directed by such Order to be slaughtered :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do order, and it is hereby ordered, that the period of four days mentioned in the said Order of the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, within which such sheep, not subjected under the said Order to quarantine, are ordered to be slaughtered, shall, notwithstanding anything in the said Order contained, be considered to be exclusive of the day of landing, and exclusive of Sunday.

This Order shall take effect on and after the nineteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
