WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the trades carried on in the factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the male young persons of not less than sixteen years of age working in such factories should be employed in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now I, the said Henry Austin Bruce, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the 25th Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do, by this, my Order, give permission to the occupiers of the said factories to employ the male young persons of not less than sixteen years of age working in such factories in the same manner as if they were male persons exceeding the age of

eighteen years, until the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
