neral Catrara to affire him, that, upon the approach of the Ch iftian Army, they will take up Arms against the Torks. An Officer of the Regiment of Streenberg; who was taken Pittoner the last year, having lately made his etcape from Reservade, has given an account to General Asperment, that the News of the Imperialists forming a Camp of 20000 Men near Especk, had greatly augmented the Consternation the People at Be grade, and the neighbouring places, were in; and that a great many Families had thereupon retired farther into the Country. That when he came from Belgrade, which was on the 6th of the last month, there were not arrived any new Troops from Constantinuple; and that those which the Serasquier had drawn together on the Frontiers, were too weak to give the Imperialists any considerable opposition.

Postdam, May 12. On Sunday the 9th Instant died here Frederick William Marquis of Brandenbingh, Great Chamberlain and Elector of the Roman Empire, Sc., in the 68th Year of his Age, and the 49th of his Government. He was first married with the Princess Laufa Henricota, Daughter of Frederick-Henry Prince of Orange; by whom he had Charles-Emile, born in the year 1655, who died at Strasbourg in 1674. Prederick-William, born in 1637, and married in 1679 to Elizab th-Henrietta, Daughter of William Landtgrave of Heffe Caffel; and after her death, to the Princels of Hanouer, in 1684. And Louis-Leopold, born in 1664, who married in 1681 with the Princels Louisa, only Daughter of Prince Bige-Plans-Radzevil of Lithuania, and died in 1687. And by his fecond Marriage with the Princels Dorothea of Holftein, Widow of Christian-Louis Duke of Lunenburgh Zell, had Philip-William born in 1669; Mary-Amelie born in 1670; Albert-Frederick in 1672; Charles-Philip in 1673; Elizabeth-Sophia in 1674; and Dorothea born in On Sunday in the Evening our present Elector, Frederick-William II. went to Berlin, where the next day he received the Complements of Condoleance; and confirmed the Officers that had ferved his Father in their feveral places. The Body of the deceafed Elector will be carried to Coning sherg in Prussia to be there interred.

The next day his Highness accompanied him to Schevelinge, where they went into a small Vessel that was prepared to carry them to the Squadron of 17 Men of War, which was come from Schonevelt, under the Command of Vice-Admiral Allemonde, and was then about a mile and half from Schwelinge: The Vice-Admiral fent two light Frigats, and feveral Shalops, to meet them; and, at their approach, faluted them with the Cannon of all the Ships: They dined on Board the Vice-Admiral, and, about 5 in the Afternoon, returned to Schevelinge, being again faluted as before, and reconducted by the two Frigats. And this morning his Electoral Highness parted from hence for Belfe, accompanied by divers Persons of Quality, intending to go to Rotterdam and Dort, and from thence to Maestricht, Liege, Aix and Cologne, and so to return home by the way of Frankfort. The Heer Van Diest, the Brandenburgh Minister, having acquainted the States-General, and the Prince of Orange, with the Death of the late Elector his Master, his Highness has named the Heer Benting to go to Berlin with his Complement of Con.

Bruffels, May 18. The Letters from Vienna, of the 5th leftant, confirm what our former told us of General Caraffia's being returned to his quarters in Translicanta; and add, that the Imperial Forces commanded by the Baron d'Arcifaga arrived the first of this mouth before Alba Regulis, and had raifed several Batteries and other Works to cover the Troops; that they had summoned the Garison, but had received for apriver, That the Musselmen knew how to defend their Places as long as they had a thop of blood to sacrifice to the service of their Sultan. That the Turks had afterwards made a Sally on the side

of the Be grade Gate, and had done the Imperialists formed damage, but were at last beaten back with the loss of 29 men; and that the Baron de circular had desired formed from the Troops, those be had with him not being sufficient to attack a place so well fortified, and provided with so good a Garison.
