"SEA FISHERIES ACT, 1868."

*Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing copy of a Note from the Imperial Minister of Foreign Affairs, stating that the French Government declare it to be impossible that the Convention relative to Fisheries, signed the 11th of November, 1867, between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French, can be brought into operation until the prohibitions contained therein have been sanctioned by the Corps Legislatif; but that arrangements have been made in order that a law to that effect may be passed with as little delay as possible.

With reference to the notification published in the Gazette of the 22nd ultimo that the day fixed

for the coming into force of "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," was on the 1st instant, notice is hereby given, that the Convention above-mentioned, which is set out in the First Schedule to that Act, has not yet been brought into operation in the manner prescribed in the 39th Article thereof, and that until it has duly come into operation, so much of "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," as relates thereto does not apply to French subjects and French vessels.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE PARISH OF ROWLEY REGIS, IN THE COUNTY OF STAFFORD.

WHEREAS under the 17th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, a Petition duly signed by owners of property and ratepayers resident within the parish of Rowley Regis, in the county of Stafford (within which parish the Local Government Act was adopted on the 10th day of August, 1868), has been duly presented to the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries, praying that the Ecclesiastical District of Reddal Hill, within the said parish, may be excluded from the operation of that Act.

And whereas inquiry has been duly directed into the circumstances of the case, and such inquiry has been duly made therein by Robert Rawlinson, Esq., the inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and the result thereof has been duly reported to me.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do issue the following Order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeal, as follows:—

That the said appeal for exclusion be dismissed. And I do hereby give notice, that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted by and for the whole of the said parish of Rowley Regis, and that from and after the date of this

Order the said Local Government Act, 1858, shall have the force of law within the said parish.

INCOME TAX.
